

Council Plans May Allow Housing

Changes to Improve Pensions

Broxtowe Borough Council's new local development plan could mean even more houses to be built in inappropriate areas.

The council's local plan is out of date and they are in the middle of writing their new development plan. Council bosses are considering options to build on our local Greenbelt, Countryside and other undesirable areas.

Residents have known for years that Labour cannot be trusted to protect our important open green spaces locally.

Now their plans are getting closer to becoming reality.

Labour are planning to allow thousands of houses to be built locally over the next few years, despite the Government not imposing figures on them.

Lib Dems are insisting that they look again at developing on brownfield sites where the development could be positive. We think our green spaces should be protected for future generations.

Hundreds of houses could be built across our area as Broxtowe Council's Labour bosses unveil their plans to develop local green spaces.



New changes are being brought in to make pensions more straight forward and fair.

Lib Dems have brought in the 'Triple-lock' which has seen pensions rise by £12.50 per week since 2010.

As well as this, other changes coming in will include: A new single pension for everyone retiring after 2017, equivalent to £144 per week - ending the over-complex system that was understood by few.

Equal treatment for both men and women for the first time ever. Women will get a full pension in their own right so the shameful situation where those who missed out because they took time out to care for their family will be ended.

Self-employed people will be fully included for the first time ever.
