

NET works update – High Road, Chilwell, outside Central College from 11th March

As you may be aware, works have been taking place in Beeston as part of the expansion of Nottingham's tram service to Chilwell.

As part of these works electricity and communication utility diversions are due to take place from Monday 11th March for approximately four weeks on High Road, Chilwell, outside Central College.

The pavement will be narrowed around the works area, but pedestrian access on High Road and to the college will be maintained throughout.

Temporary traffic lights will also be in use while these works are ongoing, so please allow extra time when travelling through this area.

These temporary traffic restrictions will be in place 24 hours a day, seven days a week until the works are completed.

These works will be carried out between 8am – 6pm, Monday – Friday and 8am - 1pm on Saturday.

These works will be carried out in accordance with the Code of Construction Practice (CoCP), which was agreed at the NET Phase Two public inquiry held in 2007.

The CoCP regulates the way that works for NET Phase Two can be undertaken, and sets out standards for our contractor on issues such as controlling noise, vibration and dust. This will ensure that works are undertaken in a responsible and sympathetic manner.

We apologise in advance for any inconvenience that these works may cause you, and would like to assure you that we will do all that we can to keep disruption to a minimum.

The next stage of tram construction works are also due to begin on Chilwell Road / High Road and on Middle Street on 25th March. This includes completing work to move utility services, installing tram tracks and tram stops on Middle Street, Styring Street, Chilwell Road and High Road.

To enable these works to progress safely the way that traffic, including buses, travels around parts of the centre of Beeston will be altered temporarily for approximately one year, and part of Chilwell Road / High Road will need to be closed to through-traffic.

We will shortly provide you with more detailed information about these works and we will be holding two drop-in sessions where you can ask questions of members of the City Council's NET Project Office and the contractor, Taylor Woodrow Alstom.
