

Extending tram services to Beeston and Chilwell



Works at the **Queens Road East / University Boulevard Junction**

Plan ahead for an easier journey

Queens Road East / University Boulevard Junction

As you will be aware, tram works are currently taking place to build a new traffic light junction where Queens Road East meets University Boulevard, as part of the expansion of Nottingham's tram network to Beeston and Chilwell.

To complete the resurfacing of the new junction, **from 8pm on Friday 29th August – 5am on Monday 1st September some temporary restrictions will apply:**

- Queens Road East will be closed at the junction so there will be no entry / exit to / from Queens Road East into / out of University Boulevard.
- University Boulevard will be reduced down to one lane in both directions through the junction.
- Traffic using the A6005 will be diverted via Woodside Road and Derby Road (Brian Clough Way A52) into Beeston using Wollaton Road and Station Road back onto the A6005.

During this period we would advise motorists to use alternative routes if possible, but for those who need to travel this way we would advise allowing extra time for journeys and due to the nature of the restrictions, be prepared to follow signed diversion routes when necessary.

Trent Barton, NCT and Your Bus services that normally travel through the junction may be diverted, please contact each operator for more details (see opposite).

Throughout these works, The University of Nottingham's west entrance will remain open with access available via Woodside Road.

Pedestrian and cyclist access will be maintained at all times, with cyclists asked to dismount while travelling through the works site.

The remainder of Queens Road East and University Boulevard will also remain open for access to properties, with access to and from the University's south entrance, the Science Park, Tennis Centre and Hockey Club always available from the Dunkirk traffic island.

Access to Beeston town centre will be available via Station Road, Wollaton Road and Broadgate and all shops and businesses will remain open as usual.

This work is being carried out during the schools' summer holidays to reduce the impact on the travelling public.

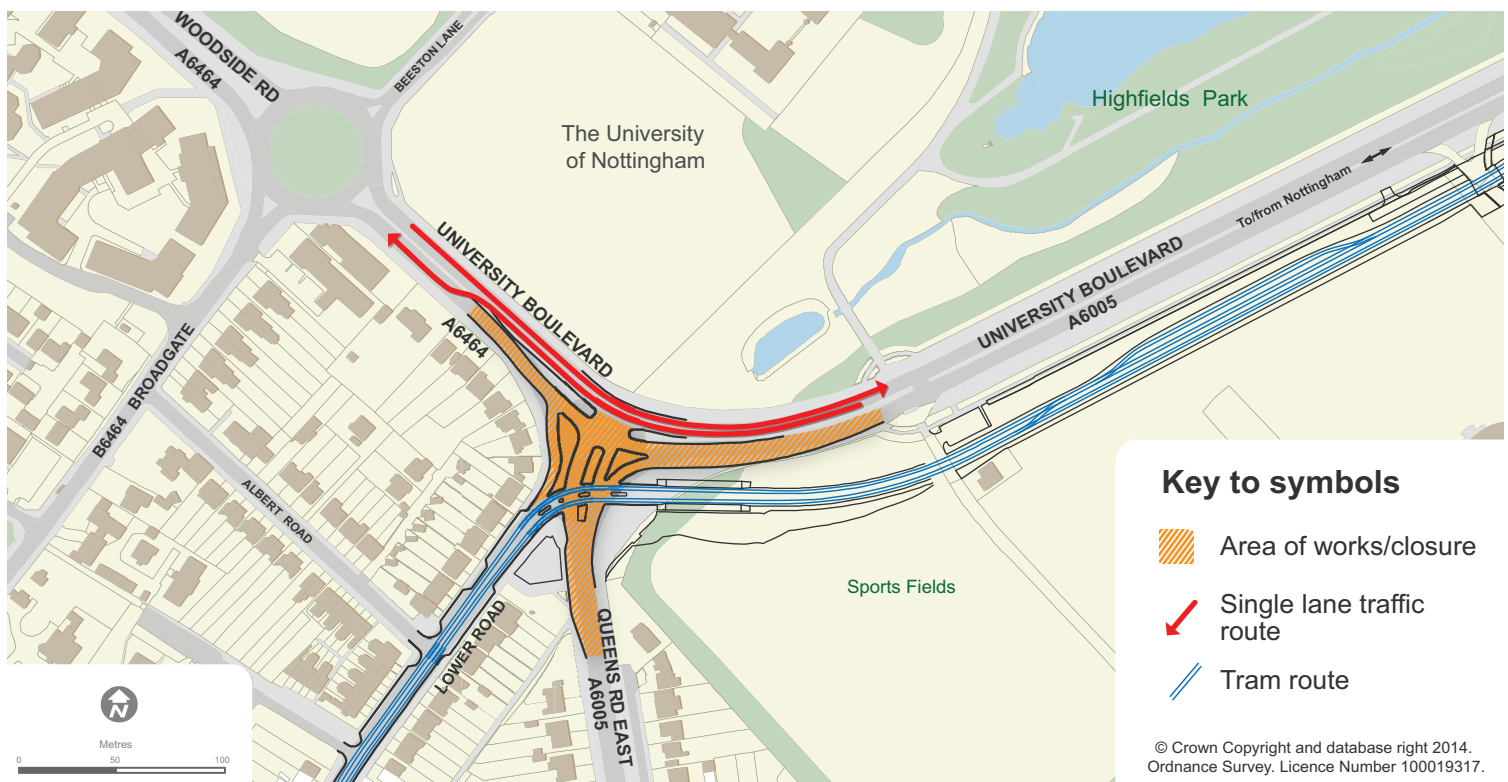
