

## University Boulevard and Beeston Road– NET works update, from 3<sup>rd</sup> September

As you may be aware, utility diversion works are taking place on University Boulevard as part of the expansion of Nottingham's tram system to Beeston and Chilwell.

As part of this work, from Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> September, electricity diversion works are due to take place along University Boulevard near the East Drive entrance to the University of Nottingham and along Beeston Road until its junction with Greenfield Street. The works should take approximately two weeks to complete.

So that these works can be completed safely, one lane city-bound and one lane westbound, towards Beeston, will be temporarily closed on Beeston Road for approximately two weeks, from the East Drive entrance to the University of Nottingham up to Beeston Road's junction with Greenfield Street.

While the works take place, the nearby bus stop (bus stop number UN04) on Beeston Road, will be temporarily moved a short distance along the road so it is just after the junction with Greenfield Street.

From Monday 10<sup>th</sup> September for approximately one week, bushes, small trees and other vegetation will be cleared out of the way of the tramway on the south side of University Boulevard, between Science Road and the Tennis Centre, for approximately one week. The nearby footway and cycleway may be slightly narrowed at times, but will be open for use while these works are taking place.

Also, from Monday 17<sup>th</sup> September, water diversion works are due to take place on University Boulevard around the exit from the Tennis Centre, for approximately four weeks. So that this work can be carried out safely, the inner westbound lane of University Boulevard towards Beeston will be temporarily closed around the exit from the Tennis Centre while these works are ongoing, and there will be no right turn onto University Boulevard from the Tennis Centre exit junction.

These temporary traffic measures will be in place 24 hours a day until the work is completed.

The works will be carried out between 8am – 6pm, Monday – Friday and 8am - 1pm on Saturday. The works will be in accordance with the Code of Construction Practice (CoCP), which was agreed at the NET Phase Two public inquiry held in 2007.

The CoCP regulates the way that works for NET Phase Two can be undertaken, and sets out standards for our contractor on issues such as controlling noise, vibration and dust. This will ensure that works are undertaken in a responsible and sympathetic manner.

We apologise in advance for any inconvenience that these works may cause you, and would like to assure you that we will do all that we can to keep disruption to a minimum.
